### AWGM ISO 9001:2015 Certified since 2008

What does ISO 9001:2015 Certified mean? Being ISO certified provides a level of confidence to our customers ensuring we can provide quality product consistently. Most of our OEM customers require us to be ISO certified in order for us to be considered as a supplier. ISO requires certified organizations to have a strong quality management system in place to ensure we have customer satisfaction in mind throughout every process within the organization. Every 4 years certified organizations go through a recertification process that involves an auditor from a 3<sup>rd</sup> party registrar who audits each of our processes to evaluate if the organization is carrying out their processes in compliance with ISO standards. Each of the 3 years prior to the recertification, the auditor performs a surveillance audit to ensure we are compliant to the ISO standards throughout the certification period. In addition to the 3<sup>rd</sup> party auditor, organizations are required to conduct annual internal audits and document their findings. Recently, Quality Manager, Landon Weld and Customer Quality Engineer, Brett Mills successfully completed an ISO 9001:2015 Lead Auditor course for AWGM. Being a certified Lead Auditor provides us with the advantage of having knowledgeable lead auditors to conduct our annual internal audits and accompany the 3<sup>rd</sup> party auditor during external audits.
